COP30: Key Priorities and Expected Outcomes

As the world turns its eyes to the Amazon – a symbol of both fragility and resilience – COP30 seeks to turn global ambition into tangible results.











Top Priorities:

- New Climate Commitments (NDCs 3.0): Countries must submit updated plans aligned with the 1.5°C target.
- New Collective Quantified Goal (NCQG): Establishing a fair and ambitious climate finance target beyond the \$100 billion pledge.
- Loss and Damage Fund: Finalizing how it will be financed and governed to support vulnerable nations.
- Amazon & Indigenous Rights: Promoting forest protection, land rights, and sustainable development.
- Just Transition: Ensuring the move to renewable energy is fair, inclusive, and people-centered.
- Article 6 Carbon Markets: Strengthening transparency and accountability to prevent greenwashing.

What's at Stake **Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)**

What is an NDC?

A Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) is a country's official climate action plan under the Paris Agreement. Each NDC explains how a nation will reduce greenhouse gas emissions, adapt to climate impacts, and contribute to the global 1.5°C goal.

Updated every five years, each NDC must show greater ambition than the previous one - this third round, "NDC 3.0," is due in 2025

These plans reveal how seriously each government takes the climate crisis. Yet, the UNFCCC's Synthesis Report shows that only one-third of countries met the September 2025 deadline.

COP30 must bridge the gaps in ambition, finance, and justice to keep the 1.5°C target alive.

"Integral Ecology and Climate Justice: A Prophetic Call to Action"

Our Position and Stand at COP30

The Claretian Team, with the support of Claretians dedicated to environmental and climate justice, has prepared this Proclade Policy Brief outlining our position and key messages for COP30. Developed with insights from grassroots communities and Claretian experts – and endorsed by the Prefects of Apostolate on behalf of their Major Organisms – it reflects the shared Claretian commitment to integral ecology and climate justice.



At its heart are seven prophetic calls urging world leaders to move beyond rhetoric to real, measurable change:

- 1. Immediate and just phase-out of fossil fuels no delay, no exception
- 2. Reparative climate finance and debt cancellation from charity to justice
- 3. Just, democratic, and community-led energy transition
- 4. Rejection of false "green" solutions
- 5. Food sovereignty and agroecology ensuring land rights and sustainable systems
- 6. Empowerment of frontline communities through direct access to finance and decision-making
- 7. Protection of environmental defenders and an end to persecution











These calls are grounded in three enduring Claretian commitments:

- Integral Ecology: Care for people and the planet are inseparable.
- Preferential Option for the Poor: The most vulnerable must be at the center of climate action.
- Prophetic Witness: Speaking truth to power with courage and solidarity.

"We will speak truth to power, stand with the vulnerable, and proclaim liberation to the oppressed. This is our hope. This is our commitment – at COP30 and beyond."
